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# Section 1

## Introduction to PrisonPAL

PrisonPAL is one of the ten important pieces of The Release Project. PrisonPAL is comprised of two parts. (Part 1) - This ministry teaches prisoners the Bible in a classroom setting. The ministry usually has 10 to 24 prisoners in a classroom type area. The prisoners are told how much we care for them and their future. We open with a prayer and then proceed to teach them about the book of John which gives them hope and also shows them that Jesus is coming here again at rapture. Everything we teach about the Bible is backed up by scripture. We teach them a foundation that will lead to success in their lives in all areas as their future life will be built upon the rock which is Christ Jesus. We show them average, normal, every day people, and how God transformed them. We show DVD films and testimonials involving people in the Bible. We pray for each one of them and try to adopt them so that they feel loved by our organization. We want them to feel as though we are their family in Christ. We teach them in baby steps. We start out with cookies, then we graduate them into apple pie, and finally how to go to baked Alaska so to speak. We give them a daily format that transforms them into a person of character, honesty, and love. Our goal when we take them through these three areas is to get them ready for society so they can function with other people in a Christ-like way that represents Jesus/God in all they do. We also get them ready for a transition center help program when they are finally released from jail. (Part 2) - PrisonPAL is currently looking for property in Lake County Florida in which

we can open our first beta test Inmate Transition Center. The name on the building will say The Elease Project and display our logo. In addition, our center in Lake County Florida will be named the Scott and Velma Dawson inmate transition center. Scott and Velma have been working with the Lake County jail for over 30 years and over 1,000 inmates have become Christians due to their diligent efforts. This center will give the inmates a place to go when released from jail instead of straight to the streets. During this three day transition stay they will be given the following:

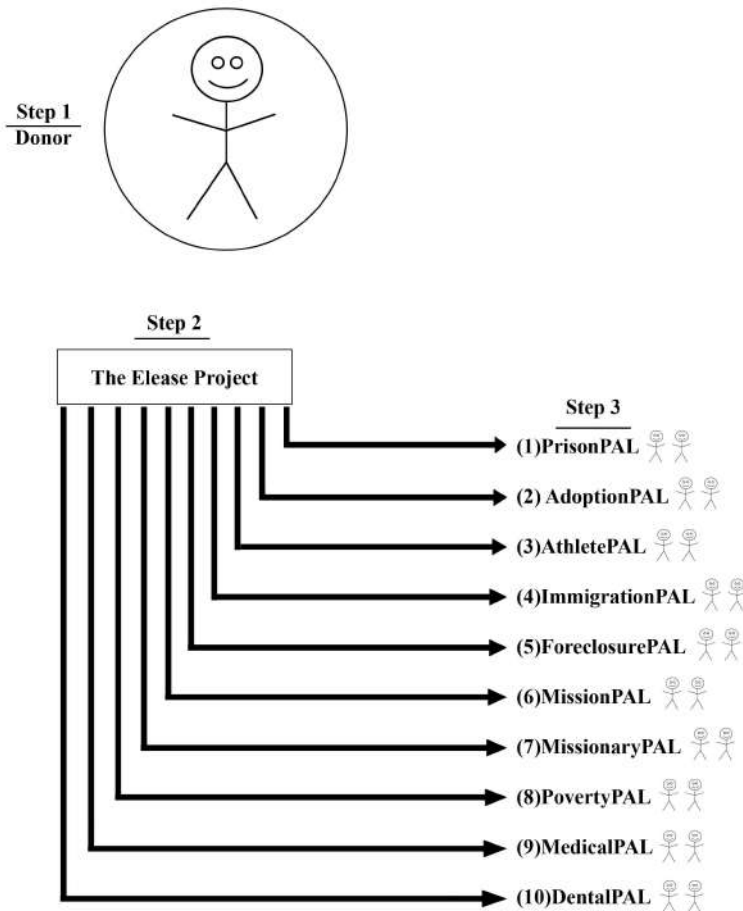
1. A bed to sleep in for up to three nights
2. Toiletry/hygiene items
3. A haircut
4. An interview to help them discover any military benefits, Medicaid benefits, and/or Medicare benefits that might be available for them
5. We give them access to a phone where they can call their relatives
6. We give them a medical check up
7. We give them a dental check up
8. We give their relatives and the released inmate a toll-free number to call to leave messages for each other until the inmate is safely with a relative
9. We use an intake form to obtain information from the inmates that evaluates their job skill levels so that we can help them get a job when released from prison
10. We give them a Bible to study and learn and we say a prayer for them when they leave or when we drop them off with a family member

# Section 2

## The Ten PALS Structure

The ten PALS (section) of The Elease Project are unique in structure. When Keith Hatchett researched the wealthy people of the United States and how they fund charities, he found an unusual problem in that the donor had to say no to many charities each year and yes to only one or two. This is a problem and an uncomfortable problem as most people hate to say no to charities.

The Elease Project was designed to help with this problem. Now a potential donor can donate to The Elease Project and their money is equally divided into ten categories. The following diagram/flowchart demonstrates the process and lists the ten individual categories.
